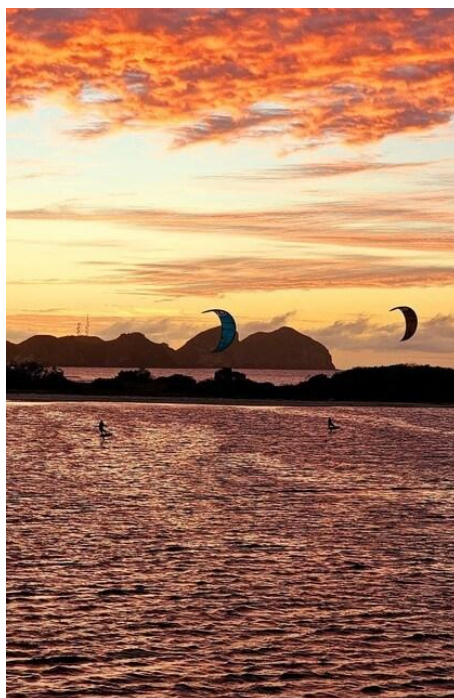

Discover Los Roques: a trip to the unspoilt Caribbean

The Caribbean archipelago of Los Roques glitters in shades of golden sand against the turquoise and emerald green of the sparkling, transparent sea. Like glass beads in a kaleidoscope, the 42 tiny islets, known as cayos, form a faint ellipse around which the coral reefs stretch. They rise gently and flatly out of the water, held together by low, drought- and salt-resistant plants such as prickly pears (tuna). Los Roques is as beautiful as a picture book, and the Venezuelan poet Joaquín Crespo claimed that stones from paradise had been shipwrecked here.

Intact underwater fauna

In 1972, the archipelago was declared a national park. The park covers 225 hectares and comprises around 250 coral reefs. They are home to a wide variety of fish species. Shoals of colourful parrotfish swim past the shallow coastline, and there are ducks, pufferfish and trumpetfish, as well as countless species of molluscs and corals, lobsters, sponges and sea urchins. This rich underwater fauna, with its unique biodiversity thanks to the intact reefs, is ideal for snorkelling and diving.



Diverse bird life

The islets also boast a wealth of frigate birds, gannets, scarlet ibis, pelicans and herons. Eighty different species of birds inhabit the mangrove thickets of the lagoons.



Genuine and pure

Those seeking a true, unspoilt Caribbean paradise will find it in the Los Roques archipelago. Over 300 islands made up of nothing but powder-white sand, lapped by turquoise blue, crystal-clear water. Protected as a national park, there is no mass tourism here. Instead of large hotels, there are only a few family-run private accommodations.



In the rhythm of the sea

Life here revolves around the sea. Days are spent sailing from one beautiful sandbank to the next, snorkelling in one of the most spectacular coral reefs in the Caribbean, and evenings are spent enjoying sundowners on the beach or on the hotel terrace. The only sounds are the lapping of the waves and the cries of the seagulls.

Organisational matters

There is no minimum number of guests required, but please note the single room supplement. Bookings can be made all year round, but a surcharge applies during the high season (Carnival, Easter week and Christmas).

Sun: Bring sunscreen with a sun protection factor of 50+.

Physical requirements

There are no special physical requirements.

However, this trip is unfortunately not suitable for people with limited mobility.

Activities and excursions

They organise daily trips to nearby islets. Parasols and sun loungers are available on the beaches. Snorkelling and diving equipment can be hired for a fee. Other popular activities on Los Roques include kite surfing and fly fishing. We will be happy to provide you with offers.

Entry and health

To enter Venezuela, you only need a passport that is valid for at least six months. Vaccinations are not mandatory, malaria prophylaxis is not necessary for most trips, but yellow fever vaccination is recommended. Facilities of the accommodation

The spacious rooms are equipped with an extra-large double bed, private bathroom and some have a small kitchenette. The accommodation has direct access to the beach, and there are quiet areas with hammocks or benches on the grounds.

Food and drink

Your accommodation is renowned for its excellent cuisine. Naturally, fish and seafood are the focus of the dishes. Try the delicious prickly pears (tunas)!

Transport

You board your small aircraft independently at the national terminal of Caracas Maiquetía Airport and are met at the landing site on Los Roques by your accommodation provider. Return flight as above.
