Natural wonders of Canaima - Where heaven touches earth

In the heart of Venezuela lies a place that blurs the boundaries between heaven and earth: Canaima, a national park of breathtaking beauty and infinite magic. Here, in the midst of lush jungle, roaring rivers and mystical table mountains, rises the most impressive natural wonder in the world - El Salto Ángel, the highest waterfall on our planet.

Untouched wilderness

With a drop of almost 1,000 metres, the Salto Ángel, known by the indigenous Pemon Kerepakupai Vena, from the summit of the majestic Auyantepuy. This waterfall is not only a spectacular natural spectacle, but also a symbol of unspoilt wilderness and the spiritual power of nature. The sight of the water dissolving into a fine mist before it touches the ground is a moment that leaves every visitor in awe.

Canaima National Park, the second largest in Venezuela and sixth largest in the world, covers more than 3 million hectares. It is a land of superlatives: lush rainforests, reddish rivers that turn into foaming waterfalls and the iconic tepuis, ancient mesas that look like fortresses from a bygone era.

The spiritual power of nature

A visit to Canaima is more than just a journey - it's a spiritual experience. Sleep in a hammock or a bed at the foot of the Salto Ángel and listen to the soothing sound of the water. Hike behind the El Sapo waterfall and feel the power of the water on your skin. Bathe in the crystal-clear waters of the El Sapito, El Yuri and El Hacha waterfalls, surrounded by lush vegetation and the song of exotic birds.

In a traditional curiara, an indigenous canoe, you travel up the Carrao River, past spectacular rock formations and dense jungle, until you reach the foot of the Salto Ángel. Here, in the midst of overwhelming nature, you will feel the connection with the earth and its original power.

Travelling to Canaima is more than an adventure - it is a return to the roots of our being.



Entry and health

For citizens of the European Union, only a passport valid for at least six months is required to enter Venezuela. Vaccinations are not mandatory – we recommend yellow fever – and malaria prophylaxis is not required for most journeys. Physical requirements

This tour does not require any particular level of physical fitness. The hikes are at a low to medium level, a certain degree of surefootedness is required (walking stick).

Accommodation facilities

Two nights at the simple Campamento Wey Tepuy in a double or shared room private bathroom; one night in hammocks at a simple camp at the foot of Salto Ángel (with a view of the waterfall).

Food and drink

We enjoy freshly prepared dishes.

Transport

Return flight from Caracas to Canaima with a local airline. All river trips in covered boats.

Equipment

Favour quick-drying clothing and comfortable shoes, take a bathing suit and remember to wear headgear. Sun and insect protection are necessary and a torch is helpful.
