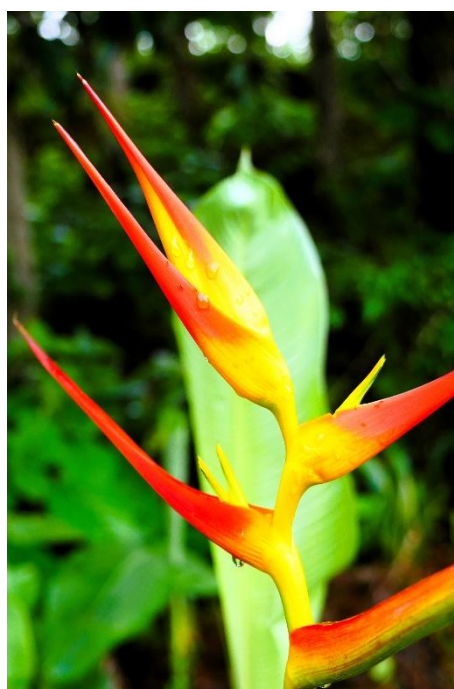

Discover the islands of Mochima National Park: Caribbean flair and underwater adventures on Venezuela's east coast

The Bocado Criollo CIRUELA combines relaxation and adventure in the midst of a unique natural paradise. Mochima National Park, which stretches along the Caribbean coast between the cities of Puerto La Cruz and Cumaná, was founded in 1973 and covers an area of almost 95,000 hectares, more than half of which is protected marine area. Mochima is a mosaic of rugged coastal mountain foothills and a diverse island landscape.

Crystal clear water and dreamlike beaches

Mochima National Park impresses with its unique landscape, where the foothills of the Turimiquire mountain range meet the Caribbean Sea. Discover the numerous bays, fjord-like inlets and white, palm-fringed sandy beaches lapped by the turquoise sea. With water temperatures between 22 and 28 degrees and a year-round warm climate, the Caribbean Sea here is a welcoming bathing pleasure all year round.



Fascinating underwater world and boat tours

A highlight is the boat trip to the islands of Isla La Piscina, Isla Arapo and Isla Arapito. Explore the aquatic worlds of the national park: the coastal waters with their pristine coral banks are an ideal habitat for an impressive variety of marine life. While snorkelling or diving, you may encounter colourful trumpetfish, curious sea turtles, elegant rays or mysterious moray eels.



Wildlife watching and nature experiences above water

The waters of Mochima National Park are known for their diverse fauna. With a bit of luck, you can observe dolphins here that live in the protected bays. The birdlife is also abundant: pelicans and seagulls often accompany the fishing boats. On land, however, in the drier coastal regions, cacti and scrubland dominate, while at higher elevations of the park lush vegetation with ferns and orchids can be found.



Cultural encounters in the mountain village of Altos de Sucre

The village of Altos de Sucre is located in the mountains above the Caribbean coast and offers you an authentic insight into rural life in Venezuela. Here you can feel the original atmosphere away from the coastal towns, far from the beaten track.

Experience a piece of untouched Venezuela – Caribbean & refreshing.

Organisational Details

A minimum number of guests is not required; please note the single room supplement of €400 where applicable. Booking is possible all year round; a surcharge may be applied during Carnival, Easter week, and Christmas.

Physical Requirements

The short hikes in the Altos de Sucre are consistently easy and require no particular level of physical fitness.

Entry & Health

For entry into Venezuela, a passport valid for at least six months is required. Upon entry, you may occasionally be asked for travel health insurance – have this confirmed in Spanish by your travel insurer and keep it, along with your booking confirmation, readily available when entering the country.

No vaccinations are mandatory, but we generally recommend a yellow fever vaccination. Malaria prophylaxis is currently not required for this trip.

The cosy accommodation features comfortable double beds and private bathrooms. On the grounds, you will find shaded spots with hammocks inviting you to relax, a small pool with a view of the Caribbean Sea for refreshing cool-down, and a boules court for some leisurely games.
