Discover an island beyond the clichés – between snow-white beaches, green mountains and ancient Spanish fortresses. Your sustainable base camp: the family-run Posada Casa de Pedro on one of the most beautiful beaches in the world, Playa El Agua.

Sustainability and nature experience

The Isla de Margarita reveals its full diversity right on its coastline:

Playa El Agua beach attracts visitors with its golden palm-lined promenade and Caribbean flair, while wind-swept El Yaque is considered a mecca for kitesurfers. Those seeking tranquillity will find it on the powder-white Playa Caribe beach. An absolute highlight is Laguna de La Restinga, where you can glide through labyrinthine mangrove tunnels. The water is so clear that you can spot starfish and delicate seahorses among the roots. The island shows a completely different face in the desert region of Macanao: in the deserted, barren landscape, you will learn about the adaptability of nature.



Culture & History

In the heart of the island, the small island capital of La Asunción enchants visitors with its colonial heritage. Stroll through cobbled streets, past pastel-coloured houses with ornate balconies, and visit the oldest church in the country. From the old Spanish forts of La Galera in Pampatar and Santa Rosa in La Asunción, guards once kept watch for pirates – today they offer breathtaking panoramic views as far as the neighbouring island of Coche. A magical moment awaits you at the salt flats of Pampatar: when the setting sun bathes the salt flats in pink and gold, the silhouettes of the wind turbines are reflected in the water – an unforgettable photo opportunity.



Culinary delights

Margarita's cuisine is as diverse as its landscapes. Be sure to try pastel de chucho, a spicy casserole with fish and plantains, or enjoy fried ceviche. Don't miss a visit to La Casa de Rubén restaurant in Porlamar. Its recently deceased chef elevated Margariteño cuisine to haute cuisine.

Margarita is not a postcard – it is a living mosaic of salt, sand and stories.

Organisational matters

There is no minimum number of guests required, but please note that a single room supplement may apply.

Physical requirements

Exploring Isla de Margarita can be done at a leisurely pace and is no problem even for people who are not particularly fit.

There are a number of water sports on offer, such as kite surfing, snorkelling and diving.

Entry and Health

Citizens of the European Union only need a passport valid for at least six months to enter Venezuela. Vaccinations are not mandatory – we recommend a yellow fever vaccination – and malaria prophylaxis is not necessary for most trips.

Accommodation facilities

The family-run Posada Casa de Pedro offers tastefully furnished rooms with comfortable beds, private bathrooms and air conditioning. There is a shaded courtyard, a restaurant and a small pool. Deck chairs and parasols are provided free of charge for your stay at Playa El Agua beach.

Food and drink

Casa de Pedro offers excellent Spanish-inspired cuisine, with a focus on fish and seafood. Breakfast is included in the price of the trip.

Transport

Your journey begins and ends at Caracas Airport in Maiquetía. On Isla de Margarita, you will be picked up at the airport in Porlamar and taken to your posada – the same applies on your return journey.

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
